COLLECTIONS

- 1 Collection of vegetables. 4 distinct kinds, 3 of each. To be displayed within an area of 24" x 24" (600 mm x 600 mm)
- 2 Basket or trug of produce, 4 kinds. Can be vegetables only or 3 vegetables and 1 fruit. Judged for culinary quality.
- 3 Singles collection. 1 specimen of 4 distinct kinds of vegetable. Previous winners of Class 1 Collection not eligible to enter this class.
- 4 Mixed collection. 2 kinds of vegetable, 2 ea, vase of flowers & a pot plant.
- 5 **NOVICE CLASS** for Members who have not won a 1st prize in any collections class in previous BDHA shows.
Basket of mixed vegetables (any kind, any number) **NOVICE**

VEGETABLES

- 6 Beans, Runner, 6
- 7 Beans, French, 6
- 8 Beetroot, 3
- 9 Carrots. Other than long, 3
- 10 Longest carrot (taproot is included in the measurement)
- 11 Courgettes WITH florets, 2 (less than 150mm long not including the floret)
- 12 Cucumber, 1
- 13 Marrows, (less than 380mm long), 2
- 14 Onions (over 250gm), 3
- 15 Onions (under 250gm), 3
- 16 Onions, Red, (250gm or under),3
- 17 Heaviest onion
- 18 Garlic, 3
- 19 Potatoes, coloured, 3
- 20 Potatoes, White, 3
- 21 Heaviest potato
- 22 Shallots, 6
- 23 Shallots, pickling, (to pass through a 30mm ring), 6
- 24 Tomatoes, 3
- 25 Tomatoes, cherry type, 5 (to pass through a 30mm ring)

- 28 Any other vegetable not included in the above classes (minimum of 2 of any variety)
- 29 Longest runner bean
- 30 Collection of herbs, 4 varieties, shown in water

NOVICE CLASS (*for members who have not won a 1st prize in any vegetable class in the previous BDHA shows*)

- 31 Tomatoes, any size, 2
- 32 Runner beans, 3
- 33 Any other vegetable, any number of specimens

Collections – Judging of Vegetables

Vegetables are judged on appoints system in collections, governed by the difficulty of producing a perfect specimen. The maximum point is a perfect specimen for some common vegetables is ; runner beans/18pts; Beetroot globe/15; Carrots (other than long) – 18; Courgettes – 12; French Beans- 15; Garlic – 15; peppers- 15; Leeks – 20; Marrows-15; Onions over 250g – 20; Onions under 250g – 15; Parsnips – 20; Potatoes – 20; Pumpkins – 10; Shallots large – 18; Shallots pickling – 15; Sweetcorn – 18; Tomatoes Large – 16; Tomatoes Small – 12; other vegetable scores are included in the RHS Handbook available from the Show Secretary 07887 489116

FRUIT

- 34 Dessert apples, with stalks, dish of 3
- 35 Cooking apples, with stalks, dish of 3
- 36 Dish of soft fruit
- 37 Any other fruit
- 38 Two kinds of fruit in separate containers, one variety per dish (any number)

NOVICE - *for members who have not a 1st prizes fruit classes in BDHA previous shows*

- 39 A dish of fruit (can be one or more varieties) **NOVICE**

FLOWERS

- 40 Dahlias, 1 vase Pom-Pom or Ball, any variety/ies, 3 blooms
- 41 Dahlias, 1 vase Cactus or Semi-Cactus, any variety/ies, 3 blooms
- 42 Dahlias, 1 vase any other type, any variety/ies 3 blooms

NOVICE (*for member who has not won 1st prize in any dahlia class in a previous BDHA show*)

- 43 Dahlias, 1 vase any variety/ies, 3 blooms (**NOVICE**)
- 44 Gladioli, 1 spike
- 45 One stem of a hydrangea
- 46 Vase of herbaceous perennial flowers
- 47 Vase of flowers grown from seed
- 48 Lavender – 5 stems in water
- 49 Vase of 3 blooms/stems, single variety, not included in any of the above classes
- 50 One stem of a flowering shrub not included in the above
- 51 Flower or flowers floating in a container of water max 250mm (10" diam)
- 52 Any flowering pot plant. Pot max. 250mm (10" diam)
- 53 Pelargonium Growing competition sponsored by the **Gardens Group** who kindly supplied plug plants and the £5 garden voucher for 1st Prize

NOVICE (for members who have not won a 1st prize in any flower class in previous BDHA shows)

54 A vase of blooms/stems, single variety

58 Jar of jam or jelly, any variety **NOVICE**

LIDS and JARS for jams and other preserves, you **may** use any plain lid, that is with no branding, no words, numbers or letters. You may use plain white, black or gold lids and those with a chequered pattern if they comply with the stated rule. Cellophane covers are not allowed. Jars must be round and – that is with no corners or any other distinguishing marks. Please ensure the date on which you made your preserve is shown on the label.

59 Loaf of bread, handmade, any shape, size or flour type

60 Almond and Chocolate cake (see Summer recipe sheet)

61 Sausage rolls, homemade pastry- 4 to be shown

62 Savoury scones, own recipe – 4 to be shown

63 Victoria sponge made with three eggs, jam filling, no top dressing

64 Fruit cake (**Ladies**) (see Summer recipe sheet)

65 Fruit cake (**Gentlemen**) (see Summer recipe sheet)

66 Home-made fruit liquor eg sloe gin, raspberry rum

Rules: *Items must not be shown that have not previously been entered in a BDHA show, worn, or used.*

- 78 A watercolour painting – amateurs only
- 79 A watercolour painting – open class (includes those who have sold work)
- 80 An oil or acrylic painting – amateurs only
- 81 An oil or acrylic painting – open class (includes those who have sold work)

Rules: *Artists' signatures/names must be covered. Items entered in previous BDHA shows not eligible. Amateur artist is defined as someone who has never sold their work at any level. If you have sold work, please enter the classes indicated.*
